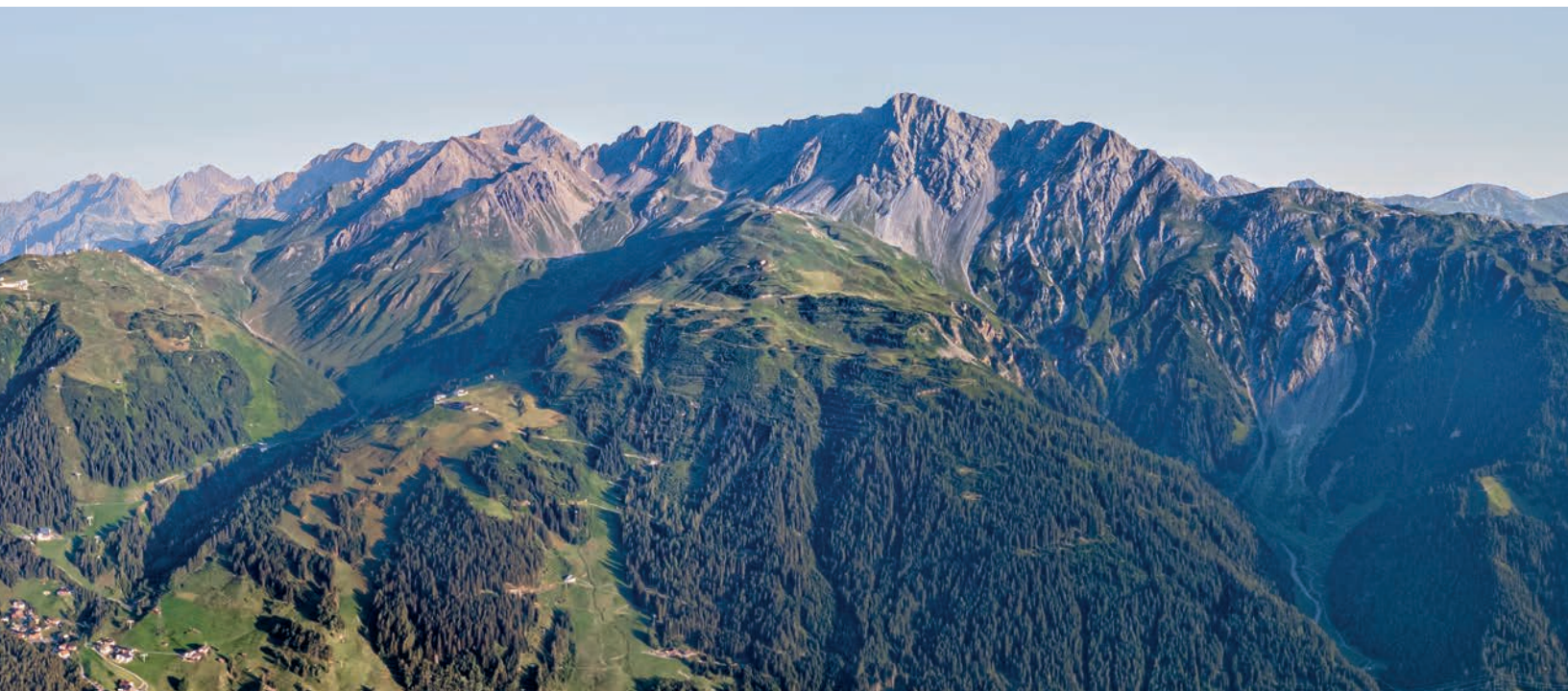
Welcome to the St. Anton am Arlberg region!

St. Anton am Arlberg

Pure mountain sports at 1,304 meters

Biking, hiking, alpine summit experiences; in all its facets, summer St. Anton am Arlberg is dominated by mountain sports against an intoxicating natural backdrop.

Hikers, mountaineers, and climbers find a wide selection of routes ranging from easy walks to high alpine. 400 kilometers of marked hiking trails, certified with the Tyrolean Hiking Seal of Quality, offer endless opportunities to experience the varied mountain world. Mountain bikers and e-bikers have over 220 kilometers of trails and numerous tour options.

A special highlight is the Verwall Adventure Valley with its legend trail, forest ropes course, suspension bridge over the roaring Rosanna, the EldoRADO bike park, the Wagner Hut, and the magnificent lake with a playground and barbecue area inviting you to linger. Guests can relax in the leisure and wellness area of the Arlberg WellCom. If the weather is not suitable for outdoor activities, guests can explore the arl.park sports center, including a new trampoline hall.

East of the village center awaits the charming district St. Jakob am Arlberg. In summer, you start from here on scenic hiking and (e-) mountain bike tours: via the Putzenalm or Rendlalm you continue to rustic mountain huts and easily accessible peaks - perfect destinations for enjoyable mountain moments. Thanks to the regular bus service, you remain flexible even without a car and comfortably reach all other highlights in and around St. Anton am Arlberg.



Pettneu am Arlberg and Schnann

Colorful program for (e-)bikers and hikers

The village Pettneu am Arlberg not only offers easy access to the extensive hiking and (e-)mountain bike area of St. Anton am Arlberg but also invites to extensive tours in the Malfontal and to the Hohen Riffler (3,186 meters). Scenic hiking tours to the Nessler Alm are also rewarding. There, the old Nessler Thaja transports you back in time, offering insight into daily life on a Stanzertal alp from 40 years ago and earlier.

Hikers can continue to ascend to the Adlerweg and the Lechtaler Höhenweg. The Leutkircher Hut and the Kaiserjoch Hut are easily accessible from here. Mountain enthusiasts are rewarded with breathtaking views reaching into the Allgu, as well as culinary delights on the huts and alms. Access to the Adlerweg and Hhenweg is also possible via Schnann. From here, you can hike to the Fritzhtte and further to the Ansbacher Hut. A fascinating themed trail „Faith & History“ is available for young and old around the village, where visitors learn about the development and history of the village and the parish at various stations. The Schnanner Gorge is known for its numerous climbing routes. Both towns are also on the Stanzertal cycle path. Since it is continuously paved, families with small children can also embark on this scenic tour.



Nature reserve and historic buildings

Flirsch is the starting point for numerous mountain and hiking tours with varying levels of difficulty. A special highlight is the sunrise hike to the Alpe Ganatsch, even to the Mittagsspitze, as well as a visit to the Msli nature reserve. The wide forest roads also make the Alpe Ganatsch an ideal excursion destination for (e-)bikers. Mountain routes to the Fritzhtte and Ansbacher Hut also climb high. Guests trace the past on themed trails „Flirsch in Old Views“ and „Chapel Circular Trail.“



Strengen

Untouched landscape

In summer, it is recommended to explore the enchanting nature and the meadows covered with alpine roses around Strengen on foot or by (e-)mountain bike. Particularly popular is the tour to the Dawinalm and the small lakes above. The Egger Weiher offers peace and relaxation. This naturally formed body of water lies above Strengen in a particularly quiet high meadow area.

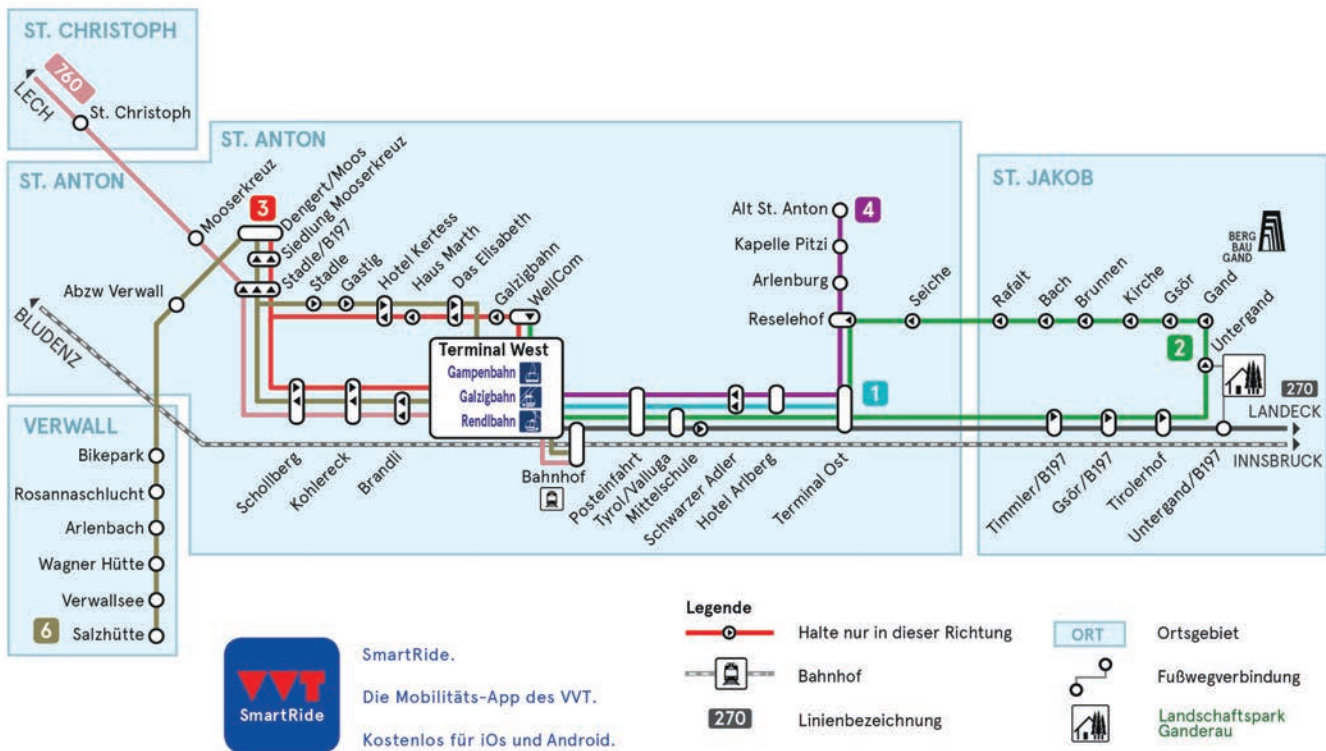

Langer See – E-Bike and Hike Tour

Explore the idyllic mountain lake in the Verwall with a lateral view of the mighty Patteriol. This tour is perfect for anyone who loves a combination of cycling and hiking. On the way back, the Konstanzer Hütte invites you to take a culinary break.

Kartellstausee – E-Bike Tour



Enjoy the view of the turquoise-blue lake, which is located in the middle of a marvellous mountain basin. This tour takes you through the Moostal valley and over the dam wall up to the lake. From there, you also have the great opportunity to visit the Darmstädter Hütte.

Malfonsee – E-Bike Tour

Explore the picturesque Malfonsee lake in Pettneu by e-bike. The tour takes you past the Malfonalpe into an unspoilt mountain valley. Enjoy the tranquillity and nature in the rear Malfon valley.

Mösli – Hiking Tour

The hiking tour to Flirscher Mösli takes you past the Flirscher waterfall and steeply up to the nature reserve. The Mösli awaits you with incredible diversity: mosses, a picturesque pond and Swiss stone pines characterise the picture, with glaciated peaks towering up behind it. The trail finally leads to the Ganatschalm, a rustic hut where you can stop for a well-earned break.

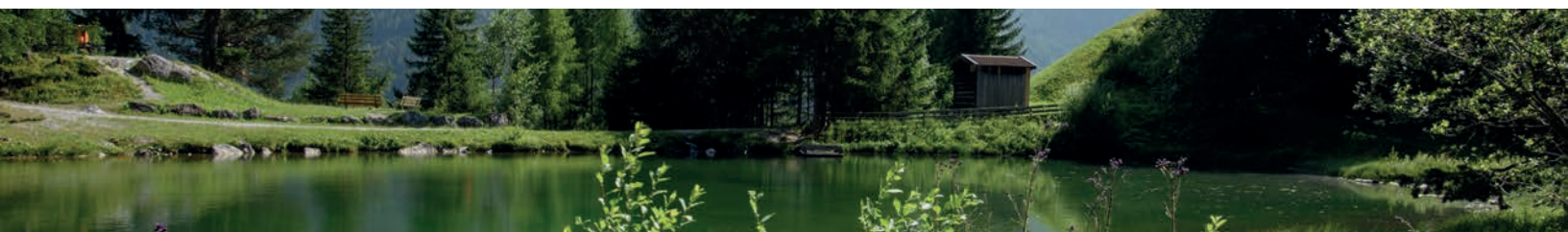

A delightful route for hiking, running and cycling leads through the Verwalltal recreation area not far from St. Anton's village centre. Past meadows, forests, streams and the emerald green Verwallsee lake the route is flat and easy to negotiate even with a pushchair. If you are looking for peace and quiet, sit down by the landscaped pond by the lake and enjoy the panorama.



EldoRADO

The EldoRADO bike area provides action and lots of fun on bikes and e-motorbikes. Every day from 10.00 - 18.00, young and old can let off steam, put their skills to the test and get professional tips on technology and equipment.



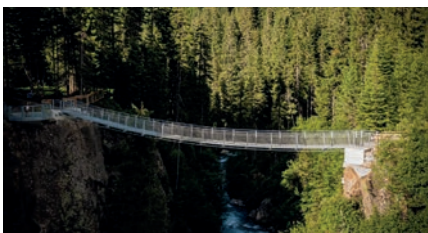
Sagastations

Visitors are given an insight into the myths and legends of the region at four stations. Playfully, interactively and with all their senses, children learn about: 'The treasure on Arlen', 'The witch of Stiegenegg', 'The Schnanner Drajer' and 'The ghost of the husband.'



Forest ropes course

Experience the newly built forest ropes course in the unspoilt Verwall Valley. You can expect 28 stations in three levels of difficulty, up to 17 metres high, as well as a practice course. There are also several flying foxes available.



Steel cable bridge

On the way to Lake Verwall, you pass the new suspension bridge, which offers a breathtaking view of the raging waters of the Rosanna. The 35-metre-long bridge elegantly joins the two banks 20 metres above the Rosanna.



Lake Verwall

Lake Verwall is a place of power and a natural jewel. Nestled in unspoilt nature, the small reservoir is a real eye-catcher. Cosy seating invites you to linger.



Barbecue areas & playground

For hungry people and barbecue specialists, there are 3 barbecue areas along the Rosanna that can be used without prior booking. There is also a playground by the lake, which makes children's eyes light up and provides the necessary fun factor.

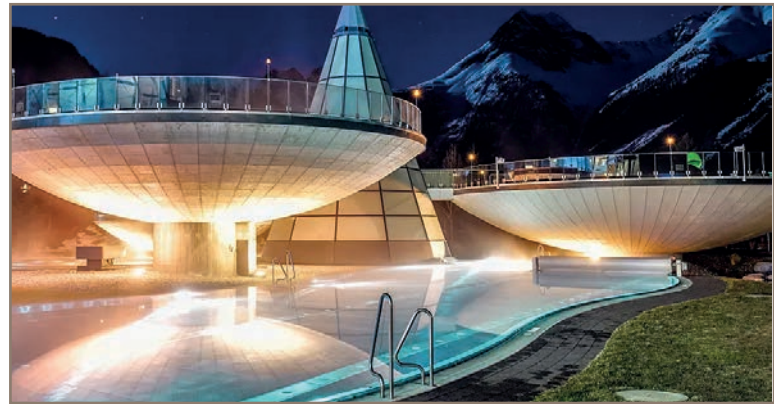

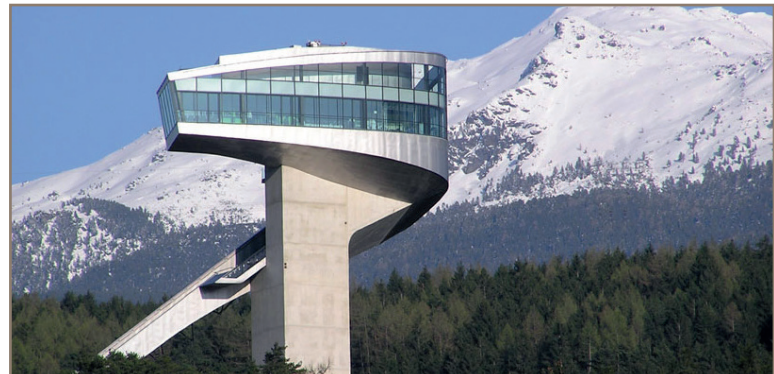

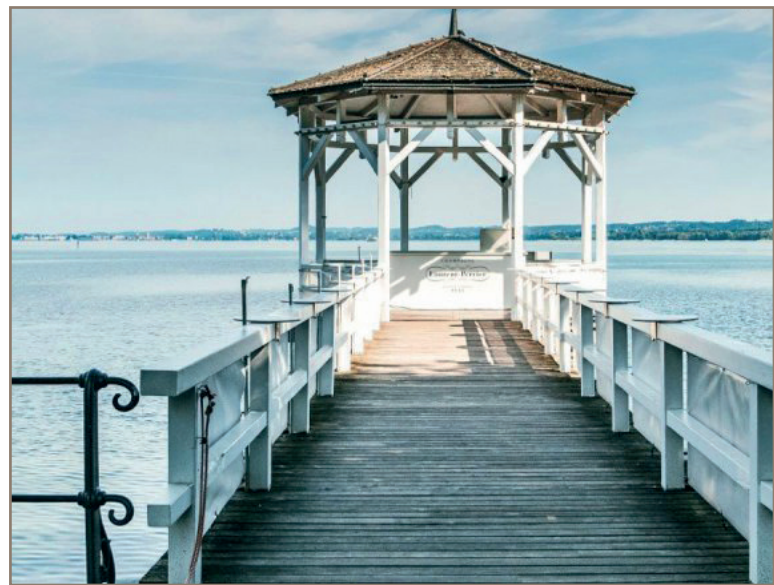
